Rabbi Alan's Message...

WE CAN LIGHT UP THE DARKNESS

Bring on the light! As we approach the end of the secular year 2024, many religions and cultures around the world celebrate the power of light. They include lighting trees, lanterns and lamps, fireworks and bonfires and we as Jews light the candles of the ***chanukiah***, the Chanukah menorah, adding a candle, and brightness each night, for 8 nights. Each custom demonstrates the revelation that each of us have within us an inextinguishable light. Let us marvel at what we see in the mirror with the same wonder as we gaze at our burning lights. Ask yourself as you look at your reflection with awe; You are amazing: how did you do that? Our tradition wants us to marvel at our own unique light and to live that life fully, to live to your true calling to fulfill the mission that God has given to each of us.

As we gaze at our lights, let's do so with gratitude. Through the light let each of us recognize our compassion, justice, and capabilities and how we benefit others as others have benefited us. Through those lights, let us recognize that what we are doing and who we are with are meant to be.

Like fish in water, we are in reality, being ourselves. Ask yourself how do I feel when I am doing certain things, does it come easily? Is it natural for me? Trust your inner wisdom and stay tuned to that light within as we gaze at the lights that glow in front of us.

In this season of light, remember that light signifies victory of light over darkness. We remember the Greeks who wanted to extinguish and remove the light from us in 167 BCE and yet we as a people persevered; as good overtakes evil and thoughtlessness. We celebrate for eight nights beginning the evening of December 25.

Let us use this time to celebrate the light that you are and the many ways you shine your light. Consider your purpose, how you have overcome challenges in your life simply by being you. Just as the moon lights the sky (and those who know me know how much I love the moon) and the moon has more songs than the sun; you are a light as you share your gifts with our congregation, the Jewish community and the wider community.

In this season of gratitude for light and life, include your willingness, determination, courage, and endurance as you continue to live in the light. Remember, your light brightens even one corner of your world, as your light can only represent love and love of life.

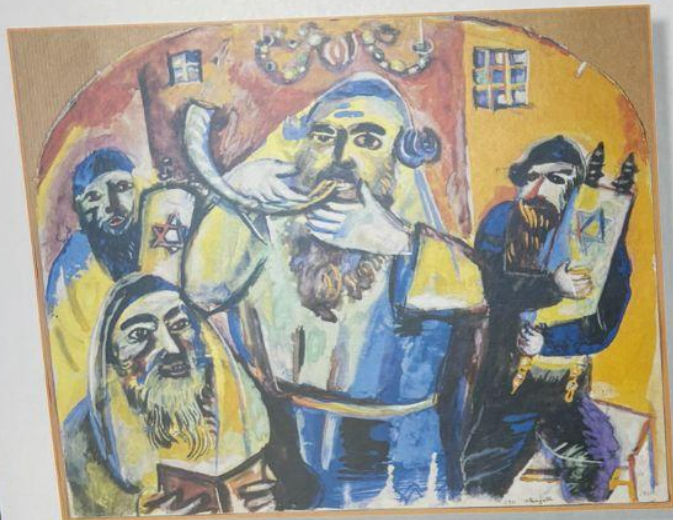
A Message from the Co-presidents...

Maureen and granddaughter observed SUKKOT traditions in Carle Park, Urbana, Illinois!



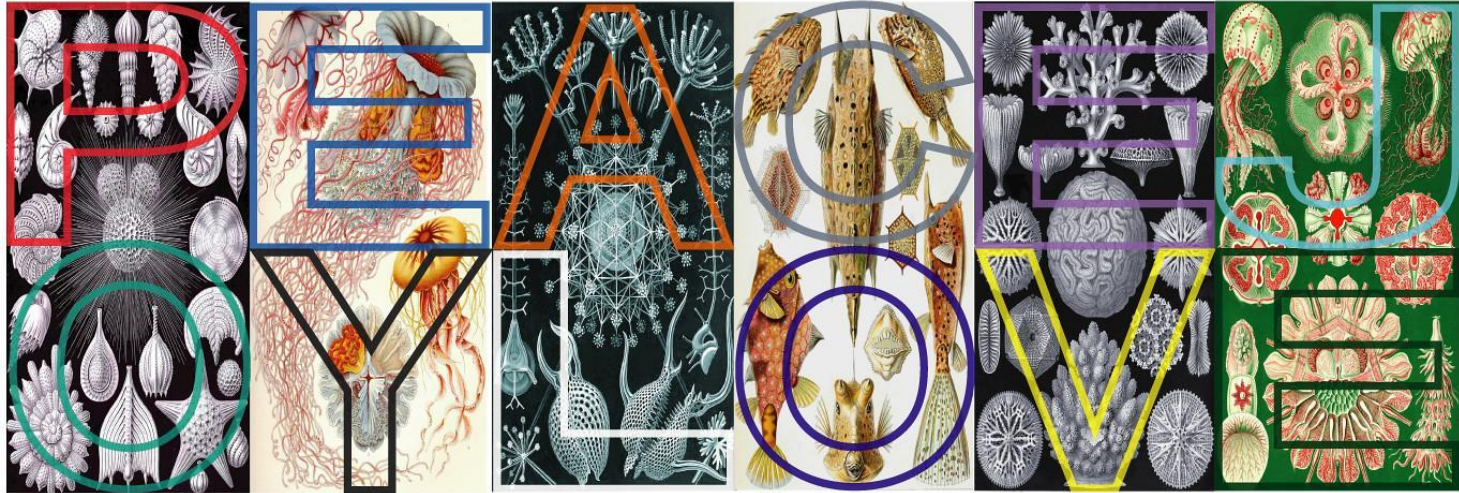
